What Coastal Back Roads Folk Told Me of Ghosts, Sea Captains, and Charleston Jazzmen

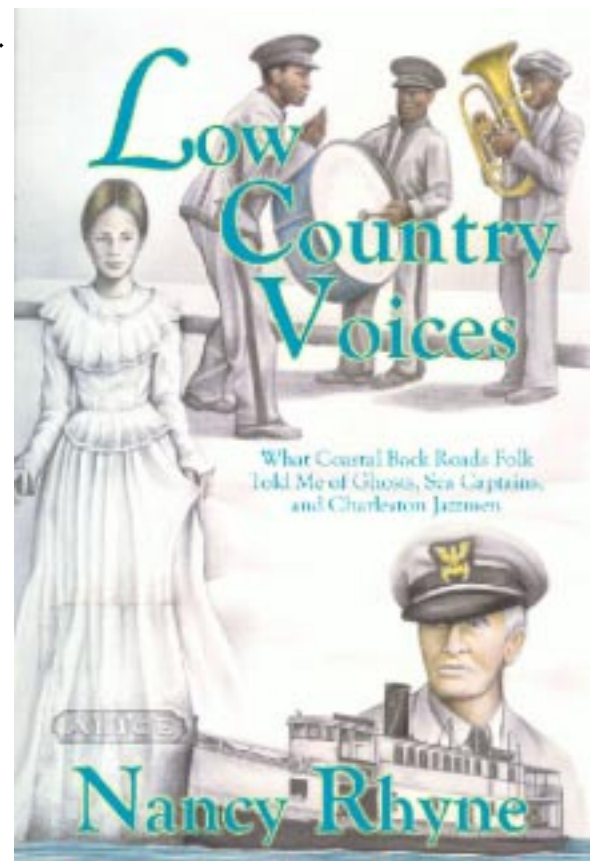
From the prologue:
